

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
Location: From NH-119 about 2.8 miles east of intersection with US-202 turn onto and follow Old New Ipswich Road for about 2.3 miles. The parking is on your right.

Conservation Land: 228 acres

Difficulty: Easy-Moderate

Trail Length: 3.5 miles

Trails feature diverse habitats including mixed hardwood forests, rocky terrain, wetlands, and meadows. Many vernal pools are documented, as well as sightings of deer, moose, turkey, bear, bobcat, red and gray fox, fisher, beaver, turtles, and more. Trails vary in difficulty from stretches appropriate for easy walking or cross-country skiing to those more suited to rugged walking and snowshoeing.

Link: Miriam Hunt Memorial Trail

Location: Diagonally across from Cutter Hill Road along NH-719; approximately 2.5 miles east of its intersection with US-202.

Conservation Land: 29 acres


Difficulty: Easy

Trail Length: 0.8 miles

Wide grassy trails loop through a mixed forest providing a view across wetlands. Ideal hiking location for families and school groups.



Tetreault Park/Town Forest



Tetreault Park and abutting Town Forest form a network of old logging trails and footpaths through trees, meadows and uplands. Trails are appropriate for walking, horseback riding, snow shoeing, nature study and birding. Park features a log cabin, tent platforms, and access to the Rail Trail. A Natural Playscape for children is located near the entrance.

Trail Length: 4.7 miles **Difficulty**: Easy-Moderate

Conservation Land: Tetreault-37 acres, Town Forest-130 acres


Location: US-202 about 1.8 miles south of NH-119; turn onto Rand Road, continue 1/2 mile

to parking.

Contoocook Marsh Conservation Complex



A wooded nature trail crosses a floating bridge and joins the Monadnock Branch Rail Trail. A footpath trail loops near the marsh with benches for viewing birds and wildlife. Adjacent area features a pond and pollinator habitat.

Trail Length: 2 miles **Difficulty:** Easy

Conservation Land: 22 acres

Location: County Road about 1.5 miles north on US-202 from intersection with

NH-119.

Schoolhouse Park

Two trails lead from the parking area through mixed forest and converge along picturesque Tarbell Brook.

Trail Length: 1/2 mile Difficulty: Easy

Conservation Land: 6.8 acres **Location:** From NH-119 turn onto Abel Road across from Pearly Pond, continue

about 1/4 mile to parking.

Ford Family Nature Preserve

Small park bordering both sides of the North Branch Millers River has birdhouses, pollinator area, benches near the water, meadows, and woods.

Conservation Land: 9 acres

Location: Turn onto North Street from NH-119 about 3.6 miles east of the intersection with US-202. Continue about 1/2 mile to the parking entrance on the right.


Sandback Wilderness

Sandback Wilderness is preserved in its natural state without maintained trails.

Conservation Land: 93 acres

Location: Turn onto East Monomonac Road from NH-119 about 3.6 miles east of the intersection with US-202. Continue about 1/2 mile, turn left onto Bush Hill Road and proceed about 1 mile to a small parking area.

Converse Meadow



Trails wind through hemlock and hardwood groves adjacent to Converse Meadow and McGregor Ponds and afford views of beautiful open wetlands. Spur trails pass over a footbridge leading to a canoe launch, offer idyllic views into the marsh, and access a tent site. A historic mill site predating revolutionary times is near the parking area.

Trail Length: 2 miles

Difficulty: Easy

Conservation Land: 240 acres

Location: About 3.5 miles east of NH-119 and US-202 intersection; turn onto Converseville Road from NH-119.

Link: Converse Meadow Trail





Help Preserve Rindge Conservation Lands

In case of emergency, CALL 911

- Hike at your own risk.
- Carry In/Carry Out remove all trash as you leave, including dog waste.
- Keep pets on leash and under control.
- No motorized vehicles except snowmobiles and maintenance vehicles.
- No camping except in permitted areas and with Conservation Commission permission.
- No fires except in permitted areas and with Rindge Fire Department approval.
- No unauthorized structures, tree cutting, or trail creation.
- No hunting except in designated areas.
 Adhere to guidelines posted at each property. All NH hunting laws apply.
